Lem Sing Lighthouse. —The geographical position of the lighthouse is:

12° 28′ 7″ N. 102° 3′ 41″ E.

The lighthouse is situated on the end of the Lem-Sing peninsula 170 metres from the beach in South.

II.

A rock that dries about $\frac{3}{4}$ feet exists 300 metres to the South of Koh-Chula's W. Point in the line. End of the Pier at Paknam point in transit with Koh-Chula W. Point.

III.

The 3 points on the W. side of the Lem-Sing peninsula are called (from S. to N.) Lem-Gating, Lem-Muh-Noi and Lem-Muh-Yai. The interjacent bays are called (from S. to N.) Aw-Yang and Aw-Muh-Noi. Both are foul. The outlines of the land are rather different from what is shown in the Admiralty Chart No. 2721. In the middle of the mouth of Aw-Muh-Yai exists a rock awash at L.W.O.S. in 10 feet 1 ⁵/₁₀ miles 33° (N. 33° E. true) from the mark-tree to the summit of Koh-Nom-Sao (Coue Island).

The bottom of the bay to the N. of Lem-Muh-Yai is called Kou-Aw. Here exists a rock awash in 7 feet $2\frac{1}{10}$ miles 16° (N. 16° E. true) from Koh-Nom-Sao mark-tree.

About 200 metres to the East of this rock exist two rocks, of which one will dry about 3 feet at L.W.O.S. These rocks are at present marked with a stake. The line Lem-Gating well clear of, Lem-Muh-Yai will lead ½ cable to the W. of the outmost rock.

A rock awash in two fathoms exists $\frac{5}{10}$ mile 83° (N. 83° E. true) from the N. point of Koh-Saba. This rock is at the present marked by a bamboo stake carrying a white and black flag $1\frac{5}{10}$ cables to the S.W. of the rock.

V.

BAR AND ENTRANCE TO THE RIVER.

Lem-Noh (Kem-nu) Koh-Saba.

A recent survey has shown a depth of 5-6 feet on the Bar at S.W.O.S. The channel inside the Bar, which is very narrow, but with considerable depths, goes close to the shore of the peninsula called Lem-Chong-Saba; the sand shoal on the E. side of the channel may generally be seen very distinctly and is partly dry. The shallowest water on the Bar is found off the N. end of Koh-Saba. In the River and Lake inside Lem-Noh is reported about 3 fathoms.
