TSINGTAU.

*Fog-signal Station Established on the Island of Taikungtao.*

NOTICE is hereby given that a Fog-signal Station has been established and is now operating on the Island of Taikungtao, at the entrance of Kiao Chow Bay.

The Signal is a detonating one, and consists of two shots fired in quick succession every 10 minutes during the period of fog. As soon as, and as long as, the fog signal from a vessel under way is heard, the double shot is fired every 5 minutes.

The time intervals may not be counted upon to be kept quite exactly.

This Notice is issued on information received from the Imperial German Government at Tsingtau.
