PETER THE GREAT BAY.

THE following is a précis of a Russian Notice to Mariners :—

The Western Entrance to Strelok Bay has been marked as follows :—

1. On the port hand, by two red and white beacons, carrying two cones, points together.

No. 1 beacon, in $5\frac{3}{4}$ fathoms, with

Cape Rodionoff $64^{\circ} 17'$, Cape Maydell $65^{\circ} 21'$, Cape Obrutcheff.

No. 2 beacon, in $5\frac{1}{4}$ fathoms, with

Cape Rodionoff $58^{\circ} 13'$, Cape Maydell $52^{\circ} 37'$, Cape Obrutcheff.

On the starboard hand, by two black and white beacons, carrying diamonds.

These beacons are on West side of the bank off Cape Foelkersam.

No. 1 beacon, in $6\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms, with

Cape Rodionoff 70° 50', Cape Maydell 65° 30', Cape Obrutcheff.

No. 2 beacon, in 5 $\frac{3}{4}$ fathoms, with

Cape Rodionoff 55° 54', Cape Maydell 46° 56', Cape Obrutcheff:

This channel is available for vessels drawing not more than 20 feet of water.

2. The West extreme of the bank off Cape Ossipoff has been marked by a red and white beacon carrying two cones, points together, in 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms, with Cape Rodionoff 50° 20', Cape Obrutcheff 91°, Waldt Rock.

3. The West extreme of the bank off Putiatin Island (opposite Cape Ossipoff) has been marked by a black and white beacon, carrying a diamond in 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms with Cape Prigluby 83° 44', Waldt Rock 56° 14', Cape Obrutcheff.

4. The South extreme of the bank off Cape Grening has been marked by a red beacon carrying a cone, point upwards, in 8 $\frac{1}{4}$ fathoms, with

Cape Startreff 98° 40', Cape Filissoff 56° 36', Waldt Rock.

GULF OF PECHILI—TAKU BAR.

Alteration in the positions of the Taku Bar inner leading marks.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Taku Bar Inner Leading Marks have been shifted.

The front mark, which is a pole painted *white* and surmounted by a *black* triangular shape, on which a Dioptric, Seventh Order, fixed *white* light is exhibited from sunset to sunrise, is situated 1.26 miles S. 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° W. of the Cavalier at North Fort. The rear mark, which is a pole painted *white* and surmounted by a *black* triangular shape, on which a Dioptric, Sixth Order, fixed *red* light is exhibited from sunset to sunrise, is situated 2,162 feet N. 72° 15' W. from the front mark.

These Marks in line lead through the channel between the Bar Light-boat and the Spit Light-boat.

All bearings given are magnetic.

FORMOSA.

PESCADORES CHANNEL.

Sabo Sho Lighthouse.

Notification No. 130.

IN accordance with Notification No. 21 of September, 1912, a Flashing Light is now exhibited from the Lighthouse which has been erected on Sabo Sho (Three I.), as follows:—

Name.—*Sabo Sho Lighthouse.*

Position.—Latitude 23° 32' 8" N.; Longitude 119° 43' 11" E. (according to the Japanese Admiralty Chart No. 235).

Construction and painting.—Octagonal brick tower, painted with black and red horizontal bands.

Height of light from the base.—36 feet.

Height of light above the water.—79 feet.

Order and character of light.—4th Order White Group Flashing Light by aceton gas, showing 2 flashes during 1 second, followed by an eclipse of 5 seconds.

Illuminated arc.—The whole horizon; but a red ray illuminates 6 degrees of horizon from N. 32° W. to N. 26° W., to cover Rokushaku Sho (Six Feet R^F), and another red ray is shown for an arc of 170 degrees of horizon from N. 29° E., through E. & S., to S. 19° W., covering Nan Sho, Kentei Gan and other dangers lying to the Westward of the Lighthouse. The bearings are magnetic and from seaward.

Candle power.—About 1,000.

Distance visible.—15 nautical miles in clear weather.

NOTE.—The Light is unwatched. Should the light go out by accident, there may be some delay before relighting it. Mariners are cautioned accordingly.
