#### PORT VICTORIA JETTY LIGHT.

Masters of Vessels, Pilots, and others are hereby informed that on and after the night of September 15th, 1913, the light which has hitherto been exhibited from the jetty, Port Victoria, will be discontinued, and from the same position will be shown a 6th order port light on a cast-iron pillar, painted red, at an elevation of 25ft. above H.W.S. tides, with the following characteristics, viz.:—It will show red fixed, between the bearings of  $165\frac{1}{2}$  deg. (S. 19 deg. E. mag.) and  $63\frac{1}{2}$  deg. (N. 59 deg. E. mag.), i.e., over Wardang Island and Eclipse Rock, and white fixed from  $63\frac{1}{2}$  deg. (N. 59 deg. E. mag.) to  $35\frac{1}{2}$  deg. (N. 31° E. mag.), all bearings being from seaward. In ordinary clear weather the white light will be visible for a distance of nine miles, and the red light for a distance of six miles.
