T the adjourned first meeting of the creditors in the above matter held at the Official Receiver's Office on the 6th day of November, 1913, at 11 a.m., it was resolved by special resolution of the creditors present to entertain a proposal for a scheme of arrangement in the following terms:—

The debtor's property shall vest in JOHN HENNESSEY SETH as Trustee under the Scheme of Arrangement and his remuneration shall be 5 per cent, on all monies collected by him.

The Trustee shall realise as soon as possible the debtor's property except the good will of the debtor's business and the trade marks used in connection therewith.

The Trustee shall as soon as praticable assign to CRUZ, BASTO AND COMPANY of Hongkong the goodwill of the debtor's business together with all trade marks used in connection therewith and such pending contracts as will in the opinion of CRUZ, BASTO AND COMPANY be likely to yield a profit subject to the fellowing terms:—

- 1. That CRUZ, BASTO AND COMPANY do forthwith establish a separate department, under the management of the debtor at a salary of \$400,00 per month, to carry on the debtor's business.
- 2. That CRUZ, BASTO AND COMPANY do finance the said department and carry on the debtor's business for 10 years with the option of closing the said department if at any time the books of the department do not show a profit.
- The books of the said department to be kept separately and to be open to inspection by the Trustee, who may also call for an account at any time.
- 4. Fifty per cent. of the net profits of the department to be paid to the Trustee for the benefit of the creditors.
- 5. If CRUZ, BASTO AND COMPANY, exercise their option to close the said department within the said term of 10 years they shall re-assign to the Trustee the goodwill of the debtor's business and the trade marks used in connection therewith and all contracts assigned to them which have not been fully completed.

The Scheme of Arrangement and draft assignment to CRUZ, PASTO AND COMPANY are deposited with the Official Receiver.

The meeting for the purpose of deciding whether the above resolution shall be confirmed will be held at the Official Receiver's Office on Monday the 24th day of November, 1913, at 11 a.m.

The proposal for a scheme of arrangement can be confirmed only by a majority in number, representing three fourths in value, of all the creditors who have proved, and is subject to the approval of the Court.


