Character.—A flashing white light every five seconds, showing thus :—

Flash, $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. Eclipse, $4\frac{1}{2}$ secs.

Elevation.—215 feet.

Visibility.—21 miles (except where obscured by Labuan Island).

Order.—3rd Dioptric.

Power.—70,000 candles.

Structure.—White framework tower, 50 feet in height, painted white with a red dome.
