Yangtze River—Kiushan Point (Round) Channel.

*Shoal Water Reported.*

NOTICE is hereby given that a vessel of 26 feet draught grounded at half-tide in the Kiushan Point (Round) Channel, Yangtze River, in a position from which Bend Beacon was bearing N. 34° E., magnetic, distant 1.5 miles. This vessel, in refloating, found the deep-water channel northward of her position of grounding, which shows that the Cooper Bank has extended northward in this vicinity.

Steps are being taken to have the locality re-sounded so soon as opportunity permits.
