Should any Permittee fail to comply with these conditions or any of them the sum deposited by him shall be forfeited to the Government and the tender or tenders made by him shall thereupon be deemed to be cancelled, and he shall be liable to make good any loss or damage which the Government may incur through his failure to comply with such conditions.
 - 10. No rates will be charged on any of these Quarries.


