Vicinity of Cooper Bank—New Channel Provisionally Opened for Deep Draught Navigation by Day.

BUOYS ESTABLISHED.

REFERRING to Special Notice to Mariners No. 586, notice is hereby given that a new channel, which will hereafter be known as the Demodocus Channel, has been provisionally opened for deep draught navigation by day, during such time as the Cooper Bank Crossing, Yangtze River, remains in a condition of rapid change. This news channel flows along the right bank of the river from Changshan into the Pitman-King-Channel.

The following Buoys have been established to mark the entrances to the new channel:—

At the Eastern Entrance: -

- A red conical Buoy has been established to mark the northern side of the eastern entrance. From the Buoy, Big Tree Beacon bears N. 37° W., distant 2.15 miles.
- A black spherical Buoy has been established on the southern side of the eastern entrance. From the Buoy, Big Tree Beacon bears N. 24° W., distant 2.36 miles.

Caution is necessary in navigating the eastern entrance, as its northern side is dangerously steep-to and the fairway only about $1\frac{1}{2}$ cables wide.

At the Western Entrance:

- A black conical Buoy has been established to mark the southern side of the western entrance. From the Buoy, the Beacon on Changshan bears S. $5\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W., distant 8 cables.
- A red spherical Buoy has been established on the northern side of the western entrance. From the Buoy, the Beacon on Changshan bears S. 33¼° W., distant I 21 miles.

Caution is necessary in navigating the western entrance, as a steep-to shoal runs along the south side of the entrance.

When it is seen that vessels are liable to meet in the eastern entrance to the Demodocus Channel, the vessel bound with the tide should be given priority of passage.

River steamers and other light-draught vessels must continue to use the Cooper Bank Crossing, as the Demodocus Channel is for the use of heavy-draught ocean-going steamers.

NOTE. Y MAN SHEET BUM

The Demodocus Channel is charted on Marine Department Chart No. 12, Kiushan Point to Bate Point, copies of which are procurable at the Coast Inspector's Office, Shanghai.

All bearings given are magnetic.
