Hongkong & Shanghai Banking Corporation.

GENTLEMEN.

The Directors have now to submit to you a General Statement of the affairs of the Bank, and Balance Sheet for the year ending 31st December, 1920.

The net profits for that period, including \$3,262,847.20, balance brought forward from last account, after paying all charges, deducting interest paid and due, and making provision for bad and doubtful accounts and contingencies, amount to \$12,104,013.50.

During the year an addition of £1.000.000 was made to the Sterling Reserve, \$3,529.411.76 of the Silver Reserve being employed for that purpose at exchange of 5/8 per Dollar. The Sterling Reserve now stands at £2,500,000.

The Directors recommend the transfer of \$2,029,411.76 from the Profit and Loss Account to credit of the Silver Reserve Fund, which will then stand at \$21,500,000.

They also recommend writing off Bank Premises Account the sum of \$1,000,000.

After making these transfers, deducting the Interim Dividend of £3 per share, paid on 9th August last, viz.:—£360,000 @ 3/8 = \$1,963,636.36, and Remuneration to Directors, there remains for appropriation \$7,080,965.38, out of which the Directors recommend the payment of a Final Dividend of Three Pounds Sterling per Share, viz., £360,000, and a Bonus of Two Pounds Sterling per Share, viz., £364,000 amounting in all to £600,000 which at 3/2, the rate of the day, will absorb \$3,789,473.69.

The Balance \$3,291,491.69 to be carried to New Profit and Loss Account.

The Sterling and Other Gold Securities have been written down to prices ruling on 31st December, 1920, and the depreciation in the £1,578,947 7s. 5d. 5% War Loan has been provided for out of the the current profits for the year.

The Sterling equivalents of the various accounts are shown at 3/2, the rate ruling on the last day of the year.

DIRECTORS.

Mr. G. T. M. EDKINS has been elected Chairman for the year 1921, and Mr. G. M. Dodwell Deputy Chairman.

The Honourable Mr. S. H. Dodwell, Mr. C. S. Gubbay, Mr. J. W. C. Ronnar, and Mr. Ross Thomson having resigned their seats on leaving the Colony, Mr. G. M. Dodwell, Mr. A. S. Gubbay, Mr. G. T. M. Edkins and Mr. A. O. Lang were invited to fill the vacancies.

These appointments require confirmation at this Meeting.

The Honourable Mr. E. V. D. PARR, Mr. A. H. COMPTON and the Honourable Mr. P. H. HOLYOAK retire in rotation, but being eligible for re-election, offer themselves accordingly.

The Accounts have been audited by Mr. F. MAITLAND and Mr. E. A. M. WILLIAMS, who offer themselves for re-election.
