TO THE

GRHINARY YEARLY GENERAL MEETING OF SHAREHOLDERS

TO BE HELD AT THE CITY HALL, HONGKONG on Saturday, the 23rd February 1924.

Hongkong & Shanghai Banking Corporation.

GENTLEMEN.

The Directors have now to submit to you a General Statement of the affairs of the Bank, and Balance Sheet for the year ending 31st December 1923.

The net profits for the year, including \$3,350,212.49, balance brought forward from last account, after paying all charges, deducting interest paid and due, and making provision for bad and doubtful accounts and contingencies, amount to \$16,583,873.49.

The Directors recommend the transfer of \$1,000,000 from the Profit and Loss Account to credit of the Silver Reserve, which will then stand at \$25,500,000.

They also recommend writing off Bank Premises Account the sum of \$1,000,000.

After making these transfers, deducting the Interim Dividend of £3 per share, paid on 7th August last, viz.:—£480,000 @ $2/3 = \$4,266,666.6\overline{7}$, and remuneration to Directors, there remains for appropriation \$10,267,206.82, out of which the Directors recommend the payment of a Final Dividend of Three Pounds Sterling per Share, viz., £480,000, and a Bonus of Two Pounds Sterling per Share, viz., £320,000, amounting in all to £800,000 which, at $2/3\frac{7}{8}$, the rate of the day, will absorb \$6,887,892.37.

The Balance \$3,379,314.45 to be carried to New Profit and Loss Account.

The Sterling equivalents of the Assets and Liabilities are shown at $2/3\frac{7}{8}$, the rate ruling on the last day of the year.

DIRECTORS.

Mr. D. G. M. Bernard has been elected Chairman for the year 1924, and Mr. W. L. Pattenden Deputy Chairman.

Mr. E. V. D. Parr, Mr. G. M. Dodwell and Mr. A. M. Bowes-Smith resigned their seats on leaving the Colony and Mr. N. L. Watson, Mr. A. H. Compton and Mr. J. P. Warren were invited to join the Board.

These appointments require confirmation at this Meeting.

Mr. G. T. M. EDKINS, Hon. Mr. A. O. LANG, and Mr. H. P. White retire in rotation, but being eligible for re-election, offer themselves accordingly.

AUDITORS.

The Accounts have been audited by Hon. Mr. A. R. Lowe and Mr. C. Bernard Brown, who offer themselves for re-election.
