Lamock Islands.

*Lamocks Main Light to be Temporarily Discontinued;  
Provisional Light to be Established.*

Notice is hereby given that on or about the 1st July, 1924, the Lamocks Main Light, Lamocks Islands, will be discontinued and the work of installing a new illuminating apparatus will be commenced.

During the time that these alterations are being made two provisional lights will be exhibited from the lighthouse, one being on the north side and one being on the south side of the tower.

These provisional lights will each show a *white* light flashing every 12 seconds, thus:—

Light ... ..  $1\frac{1}{2}$  seconds.  
Eclipse ... ..  $10\frac{1}{2}$  „

and will be so arranged that one or the other of them will be visible all round in clear weather for a distance of about 10 miles.

The installation of the new light, due notice of which will be given, is expected to be completed about the middle of August, 1924.
