On or about August 1st, 1924, the following alteration and additions to the aids to navigation to the Eastern approaches of Hongkong will be carried out:—

Cape Collinson Light.—Lat. 22° 15¾' N. Long. 114° 15¼' E.

Character of Light to be altered to Two  $\frac{1}{2}$  second flashes in quick succession every 10 seconds.

All other details of the light to remain the same.

Lyemun Pass.—Lat. 22° 17¼′ N. Long. 114° 14′ E.

- A Red flash light (U) will be exhibited on each side of the pass at the inner or Western end.
- N. Lyemun Light (U) Red flash,  $\frac{1}{2}$  second light,  $4\frac{1}{2}$  seconds eclipse, height of light above H. W. Ö. S. 24 feet.
- S. Lyemun Light (U) Red flash, ½ second light, 4½ seconds eclipse, height above H. W. O. S. 11 feet.

The structure of these two lights will be pillar lighthouses painted white.
