New Light to be Exhibited—Provisional Light to be Discontinued.

Referring to Notice to Mariners No. 788, notice is hereby given that the installation of the new lighting apparatus at Lamocks Main Light, Lamock Islands, will be completed and the new light exhibited on or about the 20th August 1924.

The character of the new apparatus will be dioptric, of the first order. The character of the new light will be group flashing, showing four lightning flashes in rapid succession every 20 seconds, and will be visible 22 miles in clear weather. The height of the centre of the light above high water is 242 feet.

The provisional lights which are at present being exhibited will be discontinued simultaneously with the exhibition of the new light.
