East Buoy Moved.

Notice is hereby given that East Buoy, Tungchow Crossing, has been moved. From the new position of the buoy, Langshan Pagoda bears S. $53\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$ E., magnetic, distant 5.08 miles.

This buoy, as heretofore, marks the southern side of the eastern end of the Crossing.

Northern entrance to Chefoo Inner Harbour.

Characteristics of Lights to be changed.

Notice is hereby given that on or about the 2nd August, 1924, the characteristics of the lights marking the Northern Entrance to Chefoo Inner Harbour are being changed as follows:—

The characteristics of the Breakwater North Beacon Light are being changed to a *white* light flashing every three seconds, thus—

Light 0.3 second,
Eclipse 2.7 Seconds.

The characteristics of the Mole End Beacon Light are being changed to a *red* light flashing every three seconds, thus—

Light 0.3 second,
Eclipse 2.7 seconds.
