BE it enacted by the Governor of Hongkong, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Fraudulent short title. Transfers of Businesses Amendment Ordinance, 1924.
- 2. Section 3 (3) of the Fraudulent Transfers of Busi-Amendment nesses Ordinance, 1923, is amended by the insertion of Ordinance the following at the end of the list of particulars specified therein:—

  Amendment of Ordinance No. 25 of 1923, s. 3 (3).
  - (e.) a statement as to the nature of the business transferred or to be transferred.

This bill is introduced on the suggestion of the Board of Trade. It proposes to add to the list of particulars which must be given in the notice referred to in the principal Ordinance a statement as to the nature of the business transferred or to be transferred.
