HARBOUR MASTER'S DEPARTMENT.

No. S. 6.—It is hereby notified that sealed tenders in triplicate, which should be clearly marked "Tender for the supply of Coal to the Hongkong Government", will be received at the Colonial Secretary's Office until Noon of Friday, the 16th day of January, 1925, for the supply of 5,000 tons of Coal with 80 % Lump and not more than 20 % ash.

Such coal to be delivered and stacked at Blackhead's Government Godown. The first consignment of 2,000 tons to be delivered not later than 1st March, 1925, and the remainder not later than the 1st April.

The cost of delivery, including baskets and stacking to be borne by the Contractor.

No tender will be received unless the person tendering produces a receipt to the effect that he has deposited in the Colonial Treasury the sum of \$500 as a pledge of the *bona fides* of his offer, which sum shall be forfeited to the Crown, if such person refuses to carry out his tender, if accepted.

The successful tenderer will be required to sign a formal contract and to give security in the sum of \$5,000 in cash to be deposited with the Colonial Treasurer for the due and faithful performance of the terms of such contract.
