*Suno Saki Lighthouse—Alteration of Light.*

Suno Saki lighthouse now shows:—

Light, alternating, flashing red and white every 30 seconds.

Visible from 002° through East to 252°.

Power.—17,000 candles.

Visibility.—18 miles.

Other details of light remain unaltered.
