Ordinance No. 2 of 1858. The Privilege was granted to the highest bidder by Tender, by the Governor in Council, from 1st January, to 28th February, 1876, for \$23,000 (£4,791.13.4), and from 1st March to 31st December, 1876, for \$110,000 (£22,916.13.4).
