It is now somewhere about three months since the Chief Justice arrived in Hongkong. But we refer especially to His Honor, the Chief Justice, to whose custody the sword has been transferred from that of our respected Police Magistrate. Under the old regime, truly it did occasionally make some desperate flourishes, but it was always kept drawn, ready either to cut or thrust, and it occasionally it did break a head or two by mistake, it never struck a foul blow. At times we may have objected to the slashing play of the amateue by whom it was wielded, but when a regular master, cunning of fence, arrived, we expected to see this instrument of justice sline a terror to evil-doing, and probe the most indude necesses of gult.
