The steamet Contain will of course be despatched to bring down the Canton correspondence in due time for the post office, the mails requiring to be poil on board on Sunday evening at 8 O'clock.

His Excellency the Governor goes north in the Vallare immediately after the despatch of the mail. For some time back a furious correspondence has been carried on between Sir John Davis and Keying. The Plato has been constantly running to and from Canton with despatches, and it is now thought that definite arrangements have been entered into, an Officer of rank having been sent down on a special mission to His Excellency last work. Whether the correspondence related to the distributions at 1800 chow-foot, the opening of Canton, or the vacating of Chusan; or whether fit embraced all these points is unknown. The vacating of Chusan is not far distant, as tenders for the conveyance of troops and stores to India are advertised for. We fear that His Excellency has not pressed upon the Chinese the necessity of pening the gates of Canton to breigners—but as this is conjecture, we refrain from censuring of ficial fatuity, which we cannot at pressur prove.

By the latest accounts, the Reer Admiral was at Madras, from whence he was to sail for China on the 18th of May, The Steamer Philegershop was deep tatched from Singapore to protect Mr Brooke and other British subjects in Borton, os soon as it was known they were in danger.

Of the ultimate success of the measure, so far as it repeals the duties on Corn, or provides for a small fixed duty, there can be no doubt. Tea has benefited by the recent reductions in Sugar, and the consump-tion of these two great staples of-revenue is so connected, that any further concession is favor of the one will increase the consumption of the

of the one will increase the consumption of the other. The representatives of the principal commercial cities intend bringing the question of tea duties before parliament, and we have no doubt that the necessity for their modification will be shewn to the satisfaction of all parties.
