Port Peddie, June 8.

Another hand writes as follows:—The Kafirs have received such a chastisement to-day as they will not easily forget. A large body of infantry, Finches and Hotentots chiefly, started last night for the Brak River, towards Stock's kraal...

SHANGHAI.

By the recent arrivals from Shanghai we are in possession of dates up to the 28th August. On the 25th markets were reported to be generally improving, Long Cloths and Woollens had both advanced in price...

(From the South African Commercial Advertiser, June 13.)

By the Post which arrived this morning better news than on some late occasions have been received from the frontier. It is now apparent that a series of successful moves has commenced, and besides the defeat of a strong force of Kafirs in their own ground...

DEFEAT OF THE KAFFIRS NEAR PORT PEDDIE.

We have the satisfaction of announcing that despatches have just reached town, brought by Lt. Bisset, &c., containing particulars of a very spirited engagement with the Kafirs yesterday at the kraal of the Kaffir chief Stock, and in which the enemy was utterly defeated, with a loss variously estimated at from 300 to 500 men...

Another individual writes—As regards the Kafirs, and have obtained a very decided victory over them. About breakfast time we heard the continued heavy firing of Artillery, with volleys of musketry, &c. Went out to the ridge towards Stock's country and could see innumerable kraals burning—the firing was continued throughout the bush for some miles...

Many of the Boers have returned with bundles of assegais, &c. Many a hand of arms have been taken, and indeed few escaped of the whole of the Kafirs engaged on this occasion. It seems that after the battle with Stock's people in the bush, Colonel Somerset with his men were coming out into the open country towards the Gwanga to procure water for their horses, and that when on the open country they fell in with a large body of Kafirs, whom they cut to pieces...

For sometime past the authorities have been on the alert in consequence of information received from the Cowloon Mandarin that a Junk, having the appearance of a Chinese War Boat had committed various acts of piracy in the neighbouring waters; on Friday afternoon last a Boat, at anchor near the Salt Janks at East Point, and answering in every particular the description given of the piratical craft, was boarded and searched by Mr. Inspector Smithers accompanied with a body of armed Policemen...

COLONIAL GOVERNORS.
The last Trinidad journals exhibit a display of
mutual good feeling between Governor and gov-
erned which is rare, we regret to say, in the his-
tory of our colonial dependencies; rare, because it
is notorious to all colonists that the Downing street
policy, with respect to their officers administering
the government of colonies, is to value them in-
versely as they stand in the scale of popularity.
This principle, in later days, was more fully de-
veloped by Lord Grey, who was the originator of
the policy of prohibiting Governors from receiving any
testimonial of respect or attachment which a grate-
ful people might be disposed to present them
either during the continuance of their government
or at its close.
The point, however to which we are anxious to
direct the attention of our readers is this. In the
address of the Trinidad Legislative Council to his
Excellency Br H. Macleod, on his resigning that
government, we find the following sentiment:—“We
trust we may be permitted also to allude to a sub-
ject too sacred for us to pass a notice, were it not
that the private characters of public men are of
public import, and to express our views on the
general good which is in fact the result of the good
character; to which the departing Governor suc-
cessfully replies, “You have been good enough to
advise to the benefit of my private character; and
you say truly, that the private character of public
men are of public import. I can assure you that
I did not undertake a government without being
fully aware of the heavy responsibility laid on me.”
