We hear that the Governor of Macao treats the affair with contempt; but it behoves us to guard against a repetition of such annoyances, as if persisted in, and the perpetrators discovered, many foolish youngmen may be implicated, and examples require to be made which will cause much unhappiness to their friends.

A more melancholy end to a long and painful struggle with the world—a more said extinction to the life of a man of genius, who has been marked by his country for more than a queste of a centry—is scarcely to be found than that of poor thaydon, who terminated his own existence on the 22'd uit. We are prepared, in some measure, hy knowing something of the feverals buttle which politicians, and Merchants, and mey of pleasure have to fight with the world, to been of one of them putting a shortend to his numerous distippointments; but it, shocks us much to find a man of genius, but it, shocks us much to find a man of genius, whose eye drinks in beauty from all creation—whose ear provisions with love—who (to use the poet's illustration), though forgotten in the distribution of the world's weath, still dwells in heaven with Jure,—it shocks us much to find such a man volgarly blowing his brains out, like a roue of the Guards, or, still more vulgarly, cutting his throat like a distempered-oriend politician. Her Mayesty, Sir Robert Peel (with distinguished generosity and self-forgetful ness, amids his great politicial struggles), the personal friends of Mr. Haydon, and the friends of his art, relived his necessities when known, or since his decease have contributed to provide for his wife and family. We are assured that colding which can be done to relieve their affliction will be neglected, and we shall cast over it to darker shadow, nor lessen his reputation, by attempting to draw from his errors and his faults a lesson that may be valuable to the world at large.

Mr. Haydon was ambitious of celebrity; and his failure to command the loss of the failustores, his praise of one branch of painting, and his deprecation of others, all shew that his paintings, his writtens, by one of the world and th

providers show by their acts that they can dispense with it for themselves, historical pictures of sub-fleets connected with religion do not speak to the quick caphing enthysissm of an admiring people.
