CIRCULAR.

Downing Street, 23d July, 1859.

Sm.—I transmit herewith for your information and guidance, the Copy of a Letter which I have received from the Lords of the matter of Privy Council for Trade, with the Copy of a Circular which their Lordships have issued to the Shipping Masters at the various result of the United Kingdom, instructing them to warn Coloured Seamen, and the Masters who may engage them, of the state of the Law in respect to free Negroes who may land in the Southern States of America, and of the necessity of such Coloured Seamen being prepared a evidence of their place of Birth and Nationality; and I have to request that you will cause similar instructions to be issued to Shipping sairs and others in the Ports of the Colony under your government.—I have the honour to be, Sir, your obedient humble servant, NEWCASTLE.

Sir —I am directed by the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 8th 2nd, with its inclosures, relative to the difficulties which occur in ascertaining and proving the nationality of British Coloured Seamen 2nd in the Seuthern Ports of the United States.

I am to acquaint you, for the information of his Grace the Duke of Newcastle, that copies of the papers forwarded in your letter have 2ndy been submitted to my Lords by the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, to whom my Lords have stated their opinion that it would be possible in this country to furnish Coloured Seamen with certificates of nativity as proposed by Mr Barclay, as the Shipping Masters whom they are engaged could have no means of ascertaining their nationality.

It would be practicable in cases where Coloured Seamen are shipped in a British ship for any voyage from a port in the United Kingdom year in the United States, to furnish certificates that they have been so shipped, but it is doubtful whether any advantage would be derivation granting such certificates.
