Herewith I have the honour to transmit, for Your Excellency's information, a Copy of a Letter from the Earl of Malmesbury, Here is that certain British Merchants in China will endeavour improperly to import Goods, &c., into Japan; and in accordance Malmesbury's wishes Her Majesty's Steam Sloop Infactible will sail for Jeddo (calling at Shanghai and Nagasaki), in two days to the Japanese Government the opinion of Her Majesty's Government on such illegal traffic, if it should be attempted, and yiolate the Laws of Japan.
