Sir,—The Harbour Master at Labuan has reported to me that the British steamer South Western struck on a coral patch not marked on the charts and having only one fathom water on it about 30 miles N.N.W. of that Island in Lat. 5° 54′ N. and Long. 115° 4′ 30″ E.
