

Power to set apart
Members of the Police
Force to do Duty as a
Naval Yard Police.

I. It shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to order any number of Members of the Police Force for the Colony of Hongkong which may be required by the Senior Naval Officer for the time being at Hongkong to be set apart for the purpose of doing special duty as a Naval Yard Police Force; Provided always that all expenses in respect of the Pay, Accoutrements, Pensions and other Disbursements whatsoever incurred under Ordinance No. 9 of 1862 or otherwise on account of the Members of the Police Force so set apart as aforesaid be paid by the Naval Department of Her Majesty's Service to the Government of Hongkong.

Ordinance to be read

II. This Ordinance and Ordinance No. 9 of 1862 shall be construed together and for all requisite purposes be deemed and taken as One Ordinance.

No. 3 OF 1867.

Title.

An Ordinance enacted by the Governor of Hongkong, with the Advice of the Legislative Council thereof, to authorize the Appropriation of a Supplementary Sum not exceeding One hundred and Twenty-five thousand Dollars to defray the Charges of the Year 1866.

[22nd May, 1867.]

Preamble.

Whereas it has become necessary to make further Provision for the Public Service of the Colony for the Year 1866, in addition to the Charge upon the Revenue for the Service of the said Year already provided for in the Estimates submitted to the Legislative Council: Be it enacted by the Governor of Hongkong, with the Advice of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

I. A Sum not exceeding One hundred and Twenty-five thousand Dollars shall be, and the same is hereby charged upon the Revenue of this Colony for the Service of the Year 1866, and the said Sum so charged shall be expended as hereinafter specified; that is to say:—
