RULES AND REGULATIONS

Made by the Governor in Council this 24th Day of August, 1867, for the proper carrying out the Provisions of Ordinance No. 8 of 1867.

- 1. The means of Ingress and Egress to and from the Old Mahomedan Cemetery shall be only by the Eastern Gate, immediately opposite the Government Water Tank.
 - 2. No Person shall be allowed to enter or leave the Cemetery by any other means.
- 3. The Mussulman Community shall have access to the Old Cemetery between the hours of 1 p.m. and 6 p.m. daily.
- 4. No Chinese shall be allowed within the walls of the Old Cemetery at any time, unless employed by the Government, or having special permission from the Governor or Surveyor General.
- 5. All sheds, huts, or buildings of any description standing within the walls of the Old Cemetery shall be forthwith removed, and such buildings shall not again be allowed to be erected.
 - 6. The keys of the Cemetery shall be kept at No. 9 Police Station, Caine Road.
- 7. Any Breach of the above Regulations may be punished by Fine not exceeding \$50, or by Imprisonment with or without Hard Labor for any period not exceeding One Month.

An Ordinance enacted by the Governor of Hongkong, with the Advice of the Legislative Council thereof, for the more effectual Protection of Her Majesty's Naval and Victualling Stores, and for the Regulation of Pawnbrokers' Licenses.

Title.

, 1867.

Be it enacted by the Governor of Hongkong, with the Advice of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:-

I. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Naval and Victualling Stores Ordinance, (Hongkong) 1867."

Short Title.

II. In this Ordinance:-

Interpretation of

The Term "The Admiralty" means the Lord High Admiral of the United "The Admiralty." Kingdom, or the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral, and shall be deemed to include the Officer in command of Her Majesty's Naval Forces on the China Station.

The Term "Dealer in Marine Stores" means a Person dealing in buying and "Dealers in Marine selling Anchors, Cables, Sails, or Old Junk, Old Iron, or Marine Stores, of any Stores." description.

The Term "Dealer in Old Metals" shall mean any Person dealing in buying "Dealer in Old and selling Old Metal, Scrap Metal, Broken Metal, or partly Manufactured Metal Metals." Goods, or Defaced or Old Metal Goods, and whether such Person deals in such articles only or together with second hand Goods or Marine Stores; and the Term "Old Metals" shall mean the said articles.

The Term "in Her Majesty's Service," when applied to Persons, applies also "In Her Majesty's to Persons in the Employment of the Admiralty.

The Term "Stores" includes any single Store or Article.

"Stores."

- III. No Person shall after the passing and coming into operation of this Ordinance License to carry on use or exercise the Trade or Business of a Dealer in Marine Stores or a Dealer in Old in Marine Stores or Mortals upless he be the holder of a License for that purpose.

 Old Metal necessary. Metals, unless he be the holder of a License for that purpose.
- IV. Every such License shall be granted by and held at the Discretion of the Licenses to be granted Governor on such Conditions as to Fees and subject to such Regulations as shall, from by the Governor subject &c. time to time, be framed by the Governor in Council.
- V. Every Dealer in Marine Stores to whom a License shall have been granted shall Holder of License to keep a Book or Books fairly written, and shall enter therein an account of all such keep Books, &c. Marine Stores or Old Metal, as he may, from time to time, become possessed of, stating in respect of each article the time at which and the Person from whom he purchased or received the same adding in the case of every such last mentioned Person a description of his business and place of abode.
- VI. Every Person to whom such License shall have been granted shall whensoever inspection of Goods, thereunto required by the Superintendent of Police or any Inspector of Police, or by Books, &c. any other Member of the Police Force, bearing a written Order in that behalf under the Hand of the said Superintendent, produce for the Inspection of the Party, so requiring him all or any Marine Stores or Old Metal in his possession or subject to his control and all Books and Papers relating to the same.

VII. If any Ferson acts in contravention of the Provisions contained in Sections III, V, or VI, le shall be liable on Summary Conviction before a Magistrate to a Penalty not exceeding Two Hundred Dollars, or to be Imprisoned for any Term not exceeding Three Months, with or without Hard Labor.

Penalties.

VIII. The Provisions of Section IV shall be applicable to all Licenses hereafter to Provisions of Section are arrived to Pawnbrokers.

IX. The Marks described in the Schedule to this Ordinance may be applied in or Marks in Schedule on Her Majesty's Naval and Victualling Stores to denote Her Majesty's Property in appropriated for Her Stores so marked.

Victualling Stores.

It shall be lawful for the Admiralty, their Contractors, Officers, and Workmen, to apply the said Marks or any of them in or on any such Stores as are described in the said Schedule.

Imitation a Misde-

If any Person, without lawful Authority (Proof of which Authority shall lie on the Party accused), applies any of the said Marks in or on any such Stores, he shall be guilty of a Misdemeanor, and shall be liable to be Imprisoned for any Term not exceeding Two Years, with or without Hard Labor.

Obliteration with Felony.

K. If any Person, with Intent to conceal Her Majesty's Property in any Naval Intent to conceal Her or Victualling Stores, takes out, destroys, or obliterates, wholly or in part, any such Mark as aforesaid, he shall be guilty of Felony, and shall be liable, in the Discretion of the Court, to be kept in Penal Servitude for any Term not exceeding Four Years, or to be Imprisoned for any Term not exceeding Two Years, with or without Hard Labor, and with or without Solitary Confinement.

Knowingly receiving, &c. marked Stores a Misdemeanor.

XI. If any Person, without lawful Authority (Proof of which Authority shall lie on the Party accused), receives, possesses, keeps, sells, or delivers any Naval or Victualling Stores bearing any such Mark as aforesaid, knowing them to bear such Mark, he shall be guilty of a Misdemeanor, and shall be liable to be Imprisoned for any Term not exceeding One Year, with or without Hard Labor.

Knowledge of Stores being marked presumed against Dealers, &c.

XII. Where the Person charged with such a Misdemeanor as last aforesaid was at the Time at which the Offence is charged to have been committed a Dealer in Marine Stores, or a Dealer in old Metals, or in Her Majesty's Service, Knowledge on his Part that the Stores to which the Charge relates bore such Mark as aforesaid shall be presumed until the contrary is shown.

Offenders may be summarily convicted in certain Cases.

XIII. Any Person charged with such a Misdemeanor as last aforesaid in relation to Stores the Value of which does not exceed Twenty-five Dollars shall be liable on Summary Conviction before a Magistrate to a Penalty not exceeding One hundred Dollars, or, in the Discretion of the Magistrate, to be Imprisoned for any Term not exceeding Six Months, with or without Hard Labor.

For the Purposes of this Ordinance, Stores shall be deemed to be in the Possession or Keeping of any Person if he knowingly has them in the actual Possession or Keeping of any other Person, or in any House, Building, Lodging, Apartment, Matshed, or Place, open or enclosed, whether occupied by himself or not, and whether the same are so had for his own Use or Benefit or for the Use or Benefit of another.

No unauthorized

XVI. It shall not be lawful for any Person, without Permission in Writing from the Person to creep, sweep, &c. for Stores Admiralty, or from some Person authorized by the Admiralty in that Behalf, to creep, within 100 Yards of sweep, dredge, or otherwise search for Stores in the Harbor of Victoria within One within 100 Yards of sweep, dredge, or otherwise search for Stores in the Harbor of Victoria within One any of Her Majesty's handled Valde C. If any Person acts in contravention of this Provision, he shall be liable, on Summary Conviction before a Magistrate, to a Penalty not exceeding Twenty-five Dollars, or to be Imprisoned for any Term not exceeding Three Months, with or without Hard

Sections 81, 82, 83, 86, 88, 90 to 99 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1865, incorporated with this Ordinance.

XVII. The following Sections of Ordinance No. 7 of 1365 being "An Ordinance to "consolidate and amend the Enactments in Force in this Colony relating to Larceny "and other similar Offences," shall be incorporated with this Ordinance, and shall for the Purposes of this Ordinance be read as if they were here re-enacted, namely, Sections LXXXI to LXXXIII, LXXXVI, LXXXVIII, and XC to XCIX all inclusive; and for this Purpose the Expression "this Ordinance," when used in the said incorporated Sections shall be taken to include the present Ordinance.

Nothing in this Ordinance shall prevent any Person from being indicted Not to prevent this Ordinance or otherwise for any indictable Offence made punishable on Sum-Persons being indicted under this Ordinance, or prevent any Person from being liable under &c. any other Ordinance or otherwise to any other or higher Penalty or Punishment than is provided for any Offence by this Ordinance so that no Person be punished twice for the same Offence.

XIX. So much of Ordinance No. 3 of 1860 as is inconsistent with the Provisions Ordinance No. 3 of of this Ordinance shall be and the same hereby is repealed.

XX. This Ordinance shall commence and take effect on such Day as shall hereafter commencement of be fixed by Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor.

Reefs &c., in the Fillippine Archipelago not noted in the Charts, communicated by Captain FAGG of the Spanish Merchant Steamer "Sud Oeste."

Reef off St. Fernando in Latitude about 16° 35' N., Longitude 0° 45' W. of Manila.—This reef I passed one morning under full steam when my attention was called by seeing the bottom quite clearly. I immediately stopped the Engines and took the following bearings. South point of the isthmus of San Fernando S. 50° E. and the Church of San Juan to the northward E. 10° N. These bearings are of course only approximations; I sounded first in 5 fathoms continued my course dead slow to the southward and had 5, 6, 6, 7, 9 and from thence out of soundings in 50 fathoms.

Another Reef also exists to the southward of the island of Sibuyan bearing from the Cresta del Gallo N.E. 4 to 5 miles. I have several times gone across this bank laying immediately in my track from Romblon to Zebu the least water I have found on it has been $5\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms.

On Wednesday the 24th July when returning from the village of Tibiao where I had been to try and salve the cargo of the Schooner Isabel Segunda lost on a Reef of Rocks that extends to the North and North East of the Island of Balbatan. I found myself suddenly over a Reef of Coral the bottom of which plainly visible. I immediately stopped the Engines and took the bearings of the Pueblo or Village of Nalupa distant about 2 to $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles E. by S., some of the rocks seemed awash, and where the Steamer was, I had $1\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms soundings varying. This Reef is well known to the small coasters on this coast although not marked in the charts.
