GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATION.

REWARD OF ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS.

Whereas on Saturday, the 27th December, 1873, the body of a Woman named Füng-a-Müi was found in the Harbor, and there is good reason to believe that she was murdered; And whereas a Girl named Füng-a-Ch'ün who was last seen with the said Füng-a-Müi is missing:—It is hereby notified that a Reward of \$100 will be paid to any Person or Persons who shall give such information to the Police as will lead to the apprehension of the guilty Persons in the case of Füng-a-Müi; and a further Reward of \$50 will be paid for the recovery of the Girl Füng-a-Ch'ün.

The above Rewards will be apportioned at the discretion of His Excellency the Governor in the event of such information being supplied by more than one Person.

A Free Pardon will be granted to any Person implicated in the Crime who may give such information, provided he is not the actual Perpetrator thereof.
