Alteration in Longships Light.

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 30, dated 28th March 1873, on an intended alteration in the Longships Light-The Trinity House, London, has given further Notice, that the new lighthouse being now completed, the alteration has been made in conformity with that notice. The light now exhibited shows white seaward between the bearings S.S.W. ½ W., and N. by W., these bearings leading half a mile outside the Brisons rocks and three quarters of a mile outside the Runnelstone. It shows red between the bearings S.S.W. ½ W. and S.W., and also between the bearings N. by W. and N.N.W. ¾ W. A red light of less power is apparent between the lighthouse and the land.

In thick or foggy weather a bell will be sounded twice in quick succession every quarter of a minute.
