No. 24 of 1886.

An Ordinance enacted by the Governor of Hongkong, with the advice of the Legislative Council thereof, to authorise the Appropriation of a Supplementary Sum of One hundred and Twenty-three thousand Seven hundred and Ninety-eight Dollars and Eleven Cents to defray the Charges of the Year 1885.

[1st October, 1886.]

WHEREAS it has become necessary to make further provision for the public service of the Colony for the year 1885, in addition to the charge upon the revenue for the service of the said year already provided for: Be it enacted by the Governor of Hongkong, with the advice of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. A sum of One hundred and Twenty-three thousand Seven hundred and Ninety-eight Dollars and Eleven Cents is hereby charged upon the revenue of this Colony for the service of the year 1885, the said sum so charged being expended as hereinafter specified; that is to say:—

WHEREAS the expenditure required for the service of this Colony for the year 1887 has been estimated at the sum of One million Ninety-four thousand Nine hundred and Fourteen Dollars: Be it enacted by the Governor of Hongkong, with the advice of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. A sum not exceeding One million Ninety-four thousand Nine hundred and Fourteen Dollars shall be and the same is hereby charged upon the revenue of this Colony for the service of the year 1887, and the said sum so charged may be expended as hereinafter specified; that is to say:—
