Objects and Reasons.

The first twenty sections of this Bill, as will be seen from the marginal notes to them, correspond with the provisions of certain Acts of Parliament, relating to solicitor's costs, which are now in force in England but have not higherty been extended to Handle and the latest them. hitherto been extended to Hongkong.

Section 21 of the Bill is borrowed from a similar provision contained in the Straits Settlements Ordinances, and in the Statutes of some of the Australian Colonies, and its object to prevent a solicitor, who has only newly arrived in the Colony and about whose antecedents and character nothing

is known, from setting up in practice on his own account.

Section 22 provides for the payment by solicitors of a

moderate fee on admission.
