BE it enacted by the Governor of Hongkong, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as

- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Solicitors Short title. Amendment Ordinance, 1899, and this Ordinance shall be read and construed as one Ordinance with the Solicitors Ordinance, 1899.
- 2. An Ordinance to amend the Rating Ordinance, 1888.

[6th November, 1899.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Hongkong, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as

- 1. This Ordinance shall be read and construct as one Construction. Ordinance with the Rating Ordinance, 1888.
- 2. The word "machinery" as used in sub-section 5 of Definition section 1 of the Rating Ordinance, 1888, shall mean machine-of "machinery used for purely industrial or manufacturing purposes. ery." ry used for purely industrial or manufacturing purposes, but shall not include lifts and machinery used as adjuncts to any tenements occupied as offices, dwellings, or hotels. Deductions In making, however, any valuation of such lifts and machinery in the future the Assessor shall deduct the expenses valuations. of working such lifts and machinery from the rateable value thereof if such expenses are paid by the landlord.

3. Every valuation which has been made by the Assessor Saving of prior to the commencement of this Ordinance under the provisions of the Rating Ordinance, 1888, shall be construed valuations. and interpreted in any Court of law as if such valuation had been made under the provisions of the Rating Ordinance, 1888, as modified by this Ordinance.
