Sir,-With reference to my Circular despatch of the 26th of January last, forwarding copies of my telegram of the 24th January and certain other documents issued in consequence of the death of Her late Majesty the Queen, I have the honour to transmit to you, for the information of your Government, a copy of "the Demise of the Crown Act, 1901," which has recently passed through Parliament and received the Royal Assent.

2. It will be observed that it provides that the holding of any Office under the Crown, whether within or without His Majesty's dominions, shall not be affected, nor shall any fresh appointment thereto be rendered necessary by the demise of the Crown.

3. I have been advised that a person holding a Dormant Commission to administer the Government of a Colony in the absence of the Governor is the holder of an office within the terms of this Act.

## CHAPTER 5.

An Act to amend the Law relating to the Holding of Offices in case of the A.D. 1901. Demise of the Crown.

[2nd July 1901.] BE it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1.—(1.) The holding of any office under the Crown, whether within or without His Effect of Majesty's dominions, shall not be affected, nor shall any fresh appointment thereto be demise of the Crown on rendered necessary, by the demise of the Crown. (2.) This Act shall take effect as from the last demise of the Crown. holding of office.

2. This Act may be cited as the Demise of the Crown Act, 1901.

Short title.
