Made by the Governor in Council under section 25 of Ordinance 13 of 1888 as amended by Ordinance 12 of 1900, this 9th day of October, 1901.

That portion of the Kowloon Peninsula which lies to the south of a line drawn between the southern corner of the Glass Works and the east end of Fifth Street is hereby specified by the Governor in Council as a district in the Colony within which (except as by Ordinance 13 of 1888 provided) no person shall discharge, kindle, or let off any firework, or attempt to do so.
