LOCAL NOTICE TO MARINERS.

No. 5.

A sandbank has formed in the West River between Si In Kau and Outer Point. Ample water channels lie on either side keeping close to the North and South banks. The sandbank is marked by a sampan made fast to a white painted spar buoy and bearing a red light on a bamboo pole between sunset and sunrise, and a red flag similarly between sunrise and sunset. In the event of strong Northerly winds the sampan will probably have to remove elsewhere and the spar-buoy will alone remain in position. At present there are 4 feet of water on sandbank. The "Bar" between the Summer and Winter Anchorage gives 2 feet more water than is on this sandbank.
