NOTICE TO MARINERS.

HONGKONG.

On 1st January, 1902, two new Harbour Lights will be exhibited as follows:—

On the $1\frac{1}{2}$ -fathom rock just inside Lyemun Pass, a Red globular lantern, displayed on a concrete pillar with staff and globe, visible all round for a distance of about one mile.

On the shore, on Eastern side of Lyemun Pass, close to Joss House, to Northward of Lyemun Point, a Red globular lantern, displayed from an iron gibbet on rock close down to beach, visible all round for a distance of about one mile.
