Made by the Governor in Council under Section 11 of Ordinance 8 of 1873.

- 1. Kerosene for which Licences are granted under Ordinance 8 of 1873, Section 11, shall be kept in the original tins in which it has been imported or in which it has been first put after being imported in bulk, which tins shall be stored in a well, sunk in the ground, and lined with brick, provided with a close fitting wooden cover lined with sheet iron, or a cover wholly of sheet iron, for the purpose of making the well airtight and of extinguishing fire in case of the Kerosene igniting.
- 2. Every licensee shall when required forthwith show to any European Police Officer the place and tins in which Kerosene in his possession is kept and shall give him such assistance as he may require for examining the same.
