- 13. The Hongkong Jockey Club shall have permission to form and fence in a temporary racing track adjoining the public road on the East side of the area to the North of the Race Course, as indicated on the aforesaid Plan, for the Official Race Meetings of the Club, subject to the condition that the rails used for the fence be put up not more than two weeks before and be removed not more than two weeks after any such meeting.
 - 14. Chinese mechanics and labourers are forbidden to use the ground as a thoroughfare.
