Notice is hereby given of the discovery of a rock with about 21 feet over it at Low Water of Spring Tides situated between Impérieuse Rock and the line of marks for clearing the same, *i.e.*, Kangsimtah Beacon and Chiotah Beacon in line. To avoid this danger, vessels, when abreast of Cornwallis Stone, should have Kangsimtah Beacon a little open to the eastward of Chiotah Beacon.
