The following Regulations made by His Excellency the Governor, under section 28 (2) of the Merchant Shipping Consolidation Ordinance, No. 26 of 1891, in substitution for those contained in Table O in the Schedule to the said Ordinance, are published.

TABLE O.

Regulations as to discharge of cannon, fire-arms, or fireworks, in the waters of the Colony. (Sub-section 2 of Section 28).

The portions of the waters of the Colony within which it is prohibited to discharge cannon, fire-arms, or fireworks, as provided by sub-section (2) of section 28 of this Ordinance, are as follows :—

- (a.) That portion having for its eastern boundary, a line drawn across the centre of the Li-u-mun Pass : and for its western boundary, a line drawn from the west end of Hongkong to the west end of Green Island, thence in a straight line to the west end of Green Island, continued to the mainland.
- (b.) That portion lying within a line drawn from the west end of Hongkong to Waterfall Bay, thence to south end of Taitam Peninsula, continued to Cape d'Aguiar and Cape Collinson, terminating at south-east corner of the Li-u-mun Pass.

N.B.—Mail Steamers may fire a gun if arriving within the above limits between 9 p.m. and 6 a.m.
