Manila.	Hongkong vessels may bring steerage passengers, and, if health of Hongkong satisfactory, can proceed direct to Manila after 1st November. Fresh vegetables prohibited.	16th October, 1902.	No. 660.
Lisbon.	Portuguese Board of Health, Lisbon, on the 15th May, 1902, declared the ports of Canton and Hongkong as infected with Cholera as from April 2nd, 1902.	8th July, 1902.	No. 420.
