The following articles are hereby declared to be Ammunition within the meaning of the above-mentioned Ordinance:—

Bombs and bomb cases, or any parts thereof.

Hand grenades and hand grenade cases, or any parts thereof, except such as can be used only for the purpose of extinguishing fires.

Any fuses which can be used for the purpose of exploding shells, bombs, or hand grenades.
