The mean minimum temperature for the month of February, 59.°9, was the highest on record. The next highest values were 59.°2 in 1898 and 58.°5 in 1890 and 1904. The mean temperature, 63.°1, has never been exceeded, but was equalled in 1890. The corresponding figures in 1898 and 1904 were 62.°7 and 62.°6. The mean maximum temperature, 66.°9, was exceeded in 1890 and 1904, the figures in these years being 68.°6 and 68.1. The absolute maximum temperature, 78.°3, was exceeded in 1890, 1891, 1892 and 1906, the figures in these years being 78.°8, 79.°0, 78.°8, and 79.°1.
