

EXECUTIVE COUNCIL.

No. 8.

Order made by the Governor in Council under Sections 3 and 4 of the Importation and Exportation Ordinance, 1915, Ordinance No. 32 of 1915, on the 10th day of January, 1918.

The Schedule to Rule 41 of the rules made by the Governor in Council under the above Ordinance is amended as follows:—

(1) The following headings are deleted:—

- (B) Aluminium, alloys of aluminium and manufactures of aluminium;
- (c) Arsenical ore;
Chemicals, &c., the following:—
 - (c) Arsenic, compounds of arsenic, and mixtures containing arsenic;
 - (B) Cresol, compounds and preparations of cresol (except saponified cresol), and nitro-cresol;
 - (B) Cresol (saponified);
- (B) Coal, except coal allowed by the Superintendent of Imports and Exports to be shipped as bunker coal;
- (B) Fencing staples;
- (c) Fishing gear, including tackle for fishing by rod and line;
Leather goods of the following descriptions:—
 - (B) Belting, hydraulic leather, pump leather and leather manufactures suitable for textile machinery;
- (B) Machinery, agricultural, and component parts thereof, including hand tools which can be used for agricultural purposes;
- (c) Nails, wire;
- (B) Oil, fish and seal, not otherwise prohibited, and mixtures containing such oils;
- (c) Oils, essential (except turpentine oil);
- (B) Oil fuel, except oil fuel allowed by the Superintendent of Imports and Exports to be shipped for use on the exporting ship;
- (B) Paper, Japanese tissue;
- (B) Rubber (raw, waste, and reclaimed), solutions containing rubber, jellies containing rubber, and any other preparations containing rubber, and also balata, gutta-percha, and the following varieties of rubber, *viz.*:—Borneo, Guayule, Jelutong, Palembang, Pontianac, and all other substances containing caoutchouc;
- (B) Tin, and alloys of tin not otherwise specifically prohibited;
- (B) Vessels;
- (B) Waxes, animal, mineral, vegetable, and composite waxes, not otherwise prohibited;
- (c) Wood-screws made of iron or steel;

(2) The following headings are added:—

- (B) Aluminium, alloys of aluminium and manufactures of aluminium, or of its alloys;
- (B) Arsenical ore;
Chemicals, &c., the following:—
 - (A) Acriflavine, proflavine and other acridine derivatives having antiseptic or ther-

- apeutic properties, and mixtures or preparations containing any of those substances ;
- (B) Arsenic, compounds of arsenic, and mixtures containing arsenic;
 - (B) Cresol, compounds and preparations of cresol and nitro-cresol ;
 - (A) Coal, except coal allowed by the Harbour Master to be shipped as bunker coal ;
 - (B) Fibre, coir ;
 - (B) Fish hooks ;
 - (C) Fishing gear, including tackle (other than fish hooks) for fishing by rod and line ;
 - Leather goods of the following descriptions :—
 - (B) Belting, leather manufactures suitable for textile machinery and leathers cut or shaped for hydraulic or pump purposes ;
 - (B) Machinery, agricultural or farming, and component parts thereof, including hand tools for agricultural or farm purposes ;
 - (B) Oil, fish, not otherwise prohibited, and mixtures containing such oil ;
 - (A) Oil fuel, except oil fuel allowed by the Harbour Master to be shipped for use on the exporting ship ;
 - (B) Oil, sandalwood ;
 - (B) Oil, seal, and mixtures containing such oil ;
 - (C) Oils, essential (except sandalwood and turpentine oils) ;
 - (C) Paper, Japanese tissue and similar cellulose paper, whether in the piece or roll or cut into shapes for domestic or other uses ;
 - (E) Rubber (raw, waste, and reclaimed), solutions containing rubber, jellies containing rubber, and any other preparations containing rubber, and also balata, gutta-percha, and the following varieties of rubber, *viz.*:—Borneo, Guayule, Jelutong, Palembang, Pontianac, and all other substances containing caoutchouc ;
 - (B) Sandalwood for medicinal purposes ;
 - Seeds, the following :—
 - (C) Vegetable, not otherwise prohibited ;
 - (A) Tin ;
 - (B) Tin, alloys of, not otherwise specifically prohibited ;
 - (A) Vessels ;
 - (B) Watches ;
 - (B) Waxes, animal, mineral, and vegetable, not otherwise prohibited ;
 - (B) Waxes, composite ;
 - (B) Wood-screws made of iron or steel.

NOTE (2).—Rule 41 (Military Stores) was published in the *Gazette* of the 18th August, 1916, and amended in the *Gazette* of the 19th October, 1917. Amendments of the schedule to that rule have been published in the following numbers of the *Gazette*, the notification of the 10th August, 1917, containing a consolidating schedule :—

NOTE (3).—Rule 37, published in the *Gazette* of the 8th December, 1916, prohibits the exportation of silver dollars and silver bullion, and Rule 38, published in the *Gazette* of the 4th May, 1916, prohibits the exportation of Chinese cash except to China.

NOTE (4).—There are special restrictions on exportation to Switzerland. See the *Gazette* of the 7th December, 1917.

NOTE (5).—The exportation of the goods mentioned in the above Schedule is prohibited as follows:—

- (1) Goods marked (A), to all destinations ;
- (2) Goods marked (B), to all ports and destinations abroad other than ports and destinations in the United Kingdom and British Possessions and Protectorates ;
- (3) Goods marked (C), to all destinations in foreign countries in Europe and on the Mediterranean and Black Seas, other than France and French Possessions, Russia, Italy and Italian Possessions, Spain and Portugal, and to all ports in any such foreign countries, and to all Russian Baltic ports ;
- (4) Goods marked (D), to all ports and destinations other than ports and destinations in the United Kingdom, British Possessions and Protectorates, France and French Possessions, Russia, and Italy and Italian Possessions, and to all Russian Baltic ports ;
- (5) Goods marked (E), to all ports and destinations other than ports and destinations in the United Kingdom.
- (6) Goods marked (F) to all ports and destinations in Sweden, Norway, Denmark and the Netherlands.

NOTE (6).—Application may be made to the Superintendent of Imports and Exports for information as to the conditions on which special licences will be granted for the exportation of prohibited articles.

Amendment of the Statutes of the University of Hongkong made by the Court of the University on the 28th day of November, 1917, under Section 14 of the University Ordinance, 1911, Ordinance No. 10 of 1911, and allowed by the Governor in Council on the 10th day of January, 1918.

Statute 2 of the Statutes of the University of Hongkong contained in the Second Schedule of the University Ordinance, 1911, is amended by adding after the words "The Teaching Staff of the University" the words "The Wardens of Hostels".
