NOTE (1).—All persons and firms resident or carrying on business within the Colony are prohibited from having, with any person or firm mentioned in this list, or in any list issued under the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, Hongkong, 1916, No. 3, any dealings other than such as are expressly authorised by paragraph 5 of the Proclamation.

† NOTE (2).—Where a person or firm mentioned in the list has more than one address in the country or group of countries under which the name of the person or firm appears, all dealings in that country, or in any country in the group, with such person or firm are prohibited, even in cases where one only of the addresses or one only of the countries is specifically mentioned.

NOTE (3).—Under the Trading with the Enemy Proclamations of the 25th June, and 10th November, 1915, all Proclamations relating to Trading with the Enemy apply to all persons or bodies of persons of enemy nationality, resident or carrying on business in China, Siam, Persia, Morocco, Liberia or Portuguese East Africa, and consequently it is an offence to trade with any person or body of persons of enemy nationality resident or carrying on business in China, Siam, Persia, Morocco, Liberia or Portuguese East Africa, even though such person or body of persons is not included by name in the Statutory List, and the omission of the name of any such person or body of persons from such list is not an authority or licence to trade with such person or body of persons.

NOTE (4).—The above additions and removals were made in the United Kingdom on the dates which appear opposite to the respective names.

NOTE (5).—A consolidating statutory list, complete to the 5th April, 1917, may be obtained from the Government Printers, Messrs. Noronha & Co., No. 14A, Des Vœux Road Central, who can also supply copies of the Orders in Council made since that date.

§ NOTE (6).—It is not unusual for firms in Holland and the Netherland East Indies to be registered under names commencing with descriptive terms such as "Handel Maatschappy" (Trading Company) or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (Limited Liability Company). In such cases it has been found more convenient to publish the firm under its proper name, followed by the general descriptive term "Handel Maatschappy" or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (N.V.), as in the case of an English company. For instance, Handel Maatschappy Louvre and Naamlooze Venootschap de Komeet v/h Dumonceau Frères will be found under Louvre and Komeet respectively, and not necessarily under "Handel" or "Naamlooze," though cross references may be given.

Order made by the Governor in Council under Sections 3 and 4 of the Importation and Exportation Ordinance, 1915, Ordinance No. 32 of 1915, on the 7th day of March, 1918.

The Schedule to Rule 41 of the rules made by the Governor in Council under the above Ordinance is amended as follows:—

- (1) The following headings are deleted:—
- (B) Coke, petroleum ;
 - (B) Coke, except petroleum coke ;
 - (B) Fire bricks and fire clay ;
 - (B) Fuel, manufactured ;
 - Insulating materials, the following:—
 - (c) Zinc-barium pigments made from zinc salts and barium sulphate (except zinc oxide) ;
 - Linen manufactures, the following:—
 - (c) Linen thread ;
 - (B) Nightlights ;
 - (B) Tools, small, the following:—
 - Knives, carpenters', coopers', farriers', glaziers', painters', and saddlers' ;
 - Shaves, coopers' and saddlers' ;
 - (B) Turpentine substitute, not otherwise specifically prohibited, and articles containing such substitute ;
 - (B) Varnishes containing shellac, oil or turpentine, not otherwise prohibited ;
 - (B) Watches.

(2) The following headings are added:—

- (B) Coke and manufactured fuel;
- (B) Fireclay, and articles manufactured of fireclay, including firebricks;
- (B) Flax cordage and twine;
- Harness and saddlery, materials and tools used in the manufacture of, the following:—
 - (B) Harness and saddlery making machines and their component parts;
 - (B) Harness and saddlery tools, hand and machine;
 - (B) Needles for harness and saddlery making machines;
- (B) Incandescent gas mantle rings;
- Linen manufactures, the following:—
 - (B) Linen thread;
- (B) Nightlights manufactured wholly or partly of paraffin wax or tallow;
- (C) Nightlights (except nightlights manufactured wholly or partly of paraffin wax or tallow);
- (B) Tools, small, the following:—
 - Knives, carpenters', coopers', farriers', glaziers', and painters';
 - Shaves, coopers';
- (A) Turpentine substitute, and articles containing turpentine substitute;
- (B) Watches and watch movements.

NOTE (1).—See the *London Gazette* of the 18th December, 1917.

NOTE (2).—Rule 41 (Military Stores) was published in the *Gazette* of the 18th August, 1916, and amended in the *Gazette* of the 19th October, 1917. Amendments of the schedule to that rule were published in various numbers of the *Gazette*, and a consolidating schedule was published in the *Gazette* of the 10th August, 1917.

The prohibitions now in force are contained in the notifications published on the following dates:—

10th August, 1917.	23rd November, 1917.
7th September, 1917.	11th January, 1918.
21st September, 1917.	1st March, 1918.
19th October, 1917.	8th March, 1918.

A complete list of notifications issued up to the end of 1917 was contained in Note (2) to Notification No. 8 of 1918, which was published in the *Gazette* of the 11th January, 1918.

NOTE (3).—Rule 37, published in the *Gazette* of the 8th December, 1916, prohibits the exportation of silver dollars and silver bullion, and Rule 38, published in the *Gazette* of the 4th May, 1916, prohibits the exportation of Chinese cash except to China.

NOTE (4).—There are special restrictions on exportation to Switzerland. See Notification No. 535 which was published in the *Gazette* of the 7th December, 1917, and Notification No. 96 published in this issue.

NOTE (5).—The exportation of the goods mentioned in the above Schedule is prohibited as follows:—

- (1) Goods marked (A), to all destinations;
- (2) Goods marked (B), to all ports and destinations abroad other than ports and destinations in the United Kingdom and British Possessions and Protectorates;
- (3) Goods marked (C), to all destinations in foreign countries in Europe and on the Mediterranean and Black Seas, other than France and French Possessions, Russia, Italy and Italian Possessions, Spain and Portugal, and to all ports in any such foreign countries, and to all Russian Baltic ports;
- (4) Goods marked (D), to all ports and destinations other than ports and destinations in the United Kingdom, British Possessions and Protectorates, France and French Possessions, Russia, and Italy and Italian Possessions, and to all Russian Baltic ports;
- (5) Goods marked (E), to all ports and destinations other than ports and destinations in the United Kingdom.
- (6) Goods marked (F) to all ports and destinations in Sweden, Norway, Denmark and the Netherlands.

NOTE (6).—Application may be made to the Superintendent of Imports and Exports for information as to the conditions on which special licences will be granted for the exportation of prohibited articles.
