EXECUTIVE COUNCIL.

No. 131.

Order made by the Governor in Council under Sections 3 and 4 of the Importation and Exportation Ordinance, 1915, Ordinance No. 32 of 1915, on the 11th day of April, 1918.

The Schedule to Rule 41 of the rules made by the Governor in Council under the above Ordinance is amended as follows:—

- (1) The following headings are deleted:—
 - (c) Algin and its compounds;

(c) Baskets and basketware;

(c) Celluloid, articles wholly or partly manufactured of:

Chemicals, etc., the following:-

(B) Ammonia and its salts, whether simple or compound (except ammonium nitrate, perchlorate, sulphate and sulphocyanide);

(B) Ammonium alum;

(B) Cinchona bark, its alkaloids and their salts;

(c) Hydrastis canadensis;

(B) Nickel, oxides and salts of (except nickel nitrate), and mixtures containing such oxides or salts of nickel;

(B) Sodium carbonate;

(c) Sodium sesquicarbonate;

- (c) Cork and cork dust, and articles manufactured from cork or cork dust;
- (B) Glue, osseine and concentrated size, fish glue, isinglass, finings and other kinds of gelatine; Leather goods of the following descriptions:—

(c) Goods manufactured wholly or partly of leather, not otherwise prohibited;

(c) Linoleum;

(c) Spirits, potable, of a strength of less than 43 degrees above proof;

(c) Wine.

(2) The following headings are added:—

(B) Algin and its compounds;

(B) Baskets and basketware;

(B) Celluloid, articles wholly or partly manufactured of;

Chemicals, etc., the following:

(B) Ammonia and its salts, whether simple or compound, and mixtures containing such salts (except ammonia liquor, liquefied ammonia, ammonium alum, ammonium carbonate, chloride, nitrate, perchlorate, sulphate and sulphocyanide, and nickel ammonium sulphate, and mixtures containing such ammonium salts);

(B) Ammonium alum and mixtures containing ammonium alum;

(B) Ammonium carbonate and mixtures containing ammonium carbonate;

(B) Ammonium chloride, including muriate of ammonia and salammoniac, and mixtures containing these substances;

- (B) Cinchona bark, its alkaloids and their salts, and preparations of any of these substances;
- (c) Hydrastis canadensis and hydrastine;
- (B) Nickel ammonium sulphate and mixtures containing nickel ammonium sulphate;
- (B) Nickel, oxides and salts of (except nickel ammonium sulphate and nickel nitrate), and mixtures containing such oxides or salts of nickel;
- (B) Sodium carbonate in all forms, including sodium sesquicarbonate and mixtures containing any of these substances;
- (B) Cork and cork dust;
- (c) Cork or cork dust, articles manufactured therefrom, not otherwise prohibited;
- (B) Glue, osseine and concentrated size (and other sizes and sizings made from glue), fish glue, isinglass, finings and other kinds of gelatine; Leather goods of the following descriptions:—
 - (B) Goods manufactured wholly or partly of leather, not otherwise prohibited;
- (B) Linoleum;
- (B) Motor cars of thirty horse-power and over;
- (B) Respirators and self-contained breathing sets intended to afford protection to the wearer against toxic atmospheres;
- (B) Size and sizings of all kinds (whether nitrogenous or not), not including articles the exportation of which is prohibited to all destinations under the prohibitions attaching to farinaceous substances, dextrine, concentrated size and other size and sizings made from glue;
- (B) Spirits, potable, of a strength of less than 43 degrees above proof;
- (B) Tools, small, the following:—
 Saws, cross cut, frame and pit;
- (B) Willows and osiers;
- (B) Wine.

Note (2).—Rule 41 (Military Stores) was published in the *Gazette* of the 18th August, 1916, and amended in the *Gazette* of the 19th October, 1917. Amendments of the schedule to that rule were published in various numbers of the *Gazette*, and a consolidating schedule was published in the *Gazette* of the 10th August, 1917.

The prohibitions now in force are contained in the notifications published on the following dates:—

A complete list of notifications issued up to the end of 1917 was contained in Note (2) to Notification No. 8 of 1918, which was published in the Gazette of the 11th January, 1918.

Note (3).—Rule 37, published in the *Gazette* of the 8th December, 1916, prohibits the exportation of silver dollars and silver bullion, and Rule 38, published in the *Gazette* of the 4th May, 1916, prohibits the exportation of Chinese cash except to China.

Note (4).—There are special restrictions on exportation to Switzerland. See Notification No. 535 which was published in the *Gazette* of the 7th December, 1917, and Notification No. 96 published in the *Gazette* of the 8th March, 1918.

Note (5).—The exportation of the goods mentioned in the above Schedule is prohibited as follows:—

- (1) Goods marked (A), to all destinations;
- (2) Goods marked (B), to all ports and destinations abroad other than ports and destinations in the United Kingdom and British Possessions and Protectorates;
- (3) Goods marked (c), to all destinations in foreign countries in Europe and on the Mediterranean and Black Seas, other than France and French Possessions, Russia, Italy and Italian Possessions, Spain and Portugal, and to all ports in any such foreign countries, and to all Russian Baltic ports;
- (4) Goods marked (D), to all ports and destinations other than ports and destinations in the United Kingdom, British Possessions and Protectorates, France and French Possessions, Russia, and Italy and Italian Possessions, and to all Russian Baltic ports;
- (5) Goods marked (E), to all ports and destinations other than ports and destinations in the United Kingdom.
- (6) Goods marked (F) to all ports and destinations in Sweden, Norway, Denmark and the Netherlands.

Note (6).—Application may be made to the Superintendent of Imports and Exports for information as to the conditions on which special licences will be granted for the exportation of prohibited articles.
