The Consuls of the Republic, or the Consular Officers of the United States in places where there is no Panamanian Consul, shall notify the shipping agencies of the foregoing disposition, so that they may not receive on their vessels passengers travelling to Panamanian territory who have not their passports in order.

Article 6.—The dispositions contained in the present Decree shall not affect in any way Panamanian citizens to whom passports were issued in accordance with the regulations in Decree No. 32 of December 6th, 1916, which shall be visés or authenticated by the consular representatives of Panama without a charge of any kind and without the necessity of the declaration referred to in Article 2 of this Decree.
