An Ordinance to amend the Non-Ferrous Metal Industry Ordinance, 1919.

[5th March, 1920.]

Be it enacted by the Governor of Hongkong, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Non-Ferrous Metal Industry Amendment Ordinance, 1920.

2. Paragraph (d) of the definition of the term "corporation under prohibited control" in the First Schedule to the Non-Ferrous Metal Industry Ordinance, 1919, is deleted and the following paragraph is substituted therefor:—

Amendment of Ordinance No. 1 of 1919, First Schedule.

(d) Where the executive is a corporation under prohibited control, or where the majority of the executive are appointed by a corporation under prohibited control.

An Ordinance to amend the Liquors Consoli-
dation Ordinance, 1911.

[5th March, 1920.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Hongkong, with the
advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof,
as follows:—Short title and construction. 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Liquors Ordinance,
1920, and shall be read and construed as one
with the Liquors Consolidation Ordinance, 1911, and the
Liquors Consolidation Ordinance, 1911, the Liquors
Ordinance, 1917, and this Ordinance may be cited
together as the Liquors Ordinances, 1911 to 1920.
Ordinances Nos. 9 of 1911 and 24 of 1917.

2. Section 9 of the Liquors Consolidation Ordinance, 1911, is repealed and the following section is substituted therefor:

Repeal of Ordinance 9 of 1911, s. 9, and substitution of new section.

Licensing Board.

- (1.) All applications for the granting or transfer of publicans licences, restaurant adjunct licences and hotel keepers adjunct licences shall be made to a Board of Licensing Justices, hereinafter called the Board.
- (2.) The Board shall consist of a chairman, vice-chairman and five other members. The members shall hold office for three years. The Magistrates' Clerk shall be *ex-officio* secretary to the Board.
- (3.) The chairman, vice-chairman and two other members shall be appointed by the Governor, and of the four members appointed by the Governor under this sub-section two shall be official and two unofficial Justices of the Peace.
- (4.) Three of the members of the Board shall be elected by the unofficial Justices of the Peace from among their number, provided that if no nomination is received, or if nominations are not received for all the vacancies announced, it shall be lawful for the Governor to appoint a Justice or Justices to fill the vacancy or vacancies.
- (5.) If any Licensing Justice who was appointed by the Governor under sub-section (3) of this section is absent from the Colony it shall be lawful for the Governor to appoint another Justice to act as a member of the Board during the absence of the substantive member. Such acting member shall be an official or an unofficial Justice according as the substantive member is an official or an unofficial Justice.
- (6.) If any Licensing Justice who was elected or appointed under sub-section (4) of this section is absent from the Colony it shall be lawful for the unofficial Justices of the Peace to elect from among their number a Justice to act as a member of the Board during the absence of the substantive member, provided that an acting member may be appointed by the Governor if no nomination is received for the acting appointment.
- (7.) Three members of the Board, one of whom must be the chairman or vice-chairman, shall form a quorum.
