Order made by the Governor in Council under section 16 of the Gunpowder and Fireworks Ordinance, 1901, Ordinance No. 14 of 1901, on the 30th day of June, 1921.

No person shall make, sell, or have in his possession any fireworks which explode by detonation, or which contain any explosive ingredient or mixture other than black gunpowder, charcoal, sulphur and saltpetre.

Note:—The object of this Order in Council is to prohibit the use of certain dangerous kinds of fireworks. The use of dangerous fireworks led to the loss of several lives at the time of the last Chinese New Year festival. The principal kinds of fireworks prohibited by this Order in Council are tei lui p'au (地 雷炮), kam ts'in (金銭), and tin kwong p'au (電光炮).
